Education Support (Scholarships)

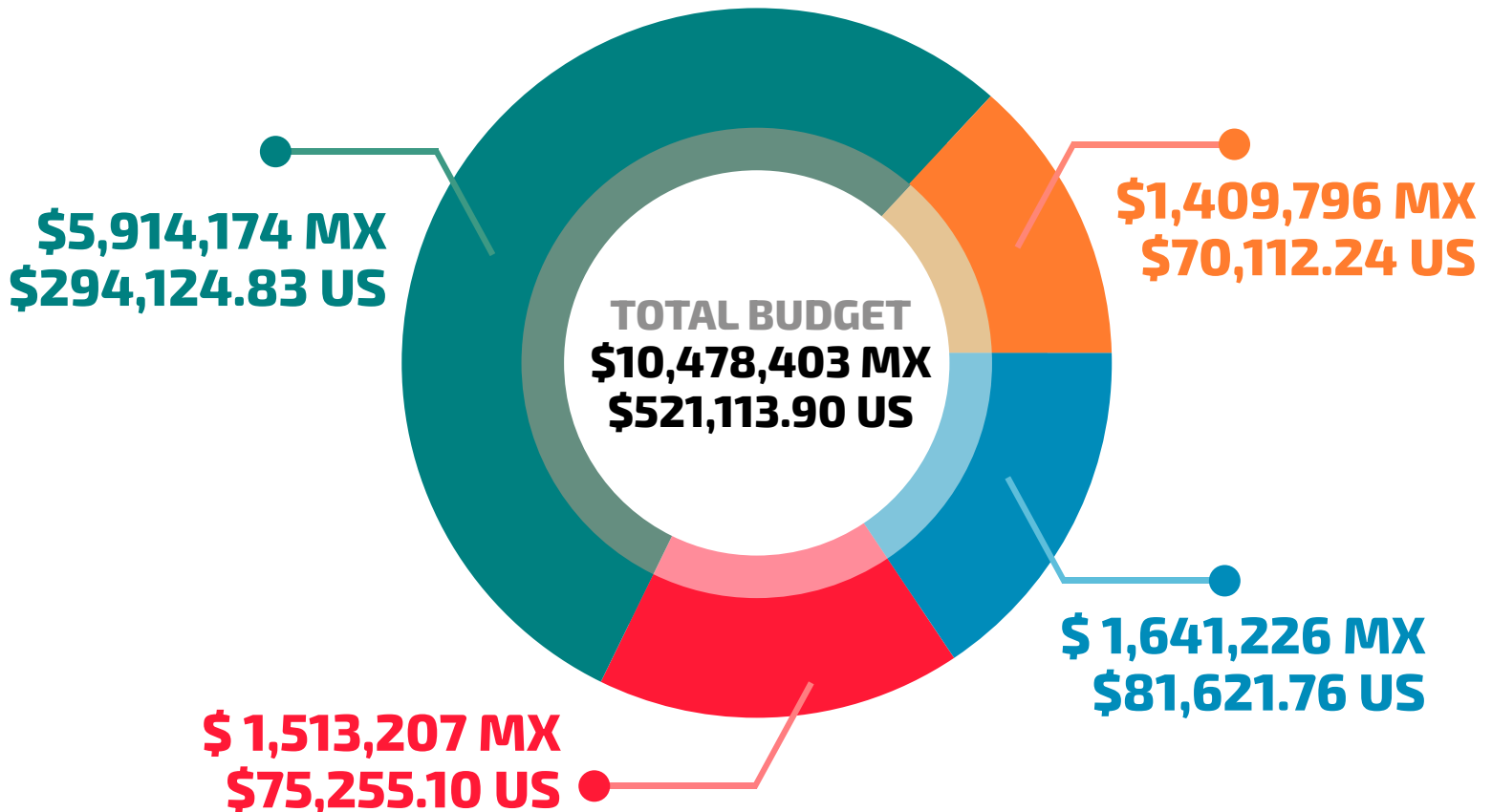

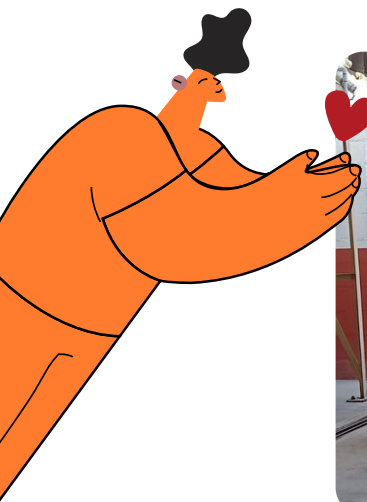


CAUSE-RELATED FUNDS

Continuing our tradition from previous years, we extended our support to the Father Chava's Breakfast Program of the Salesian Project by covering the monthly gas expenses. This contribution has played a crucial role in facilitating the provision of nutritious breakfasts to migrants and vulnerable populations throughout 2022. 310,752 breakfasts were served in 2022. This support was provided through the Rafael T. Arnaiz and ARGA Foundation Funds.



Casa Eudes Promotion for Women, A.C., an organization that provides a home for 85 girls, boys, and teenagers, received substantial support through the coverage of their gas and electricity expenses. By taking care of the gas and electricity costs, we have alleviated a significant financial burden for Casa Eudes, allowing them to allocate their resources towards other essential areas, such as education, healthcare, and overall well-being of the children and teenagers under their care. This assistance was made possible through the Rafael T. Arnaiz and ARGA Foundation Funds.



CAUSE-RELATED FUNDS

With funds from the ARGA Foundation Fund donated to BARAQUIEN D. FIMBRES FOUNDATION., we covered operational expenses of the Elderly Assistance Home "El Centro del Anciano", where 20 elderly individuals over the age of 70 have been benefited. Through these partnerships and investments, we have made a positive impact on the lives of the elderly individuals residing at "El Centro del Anciano," ensuring they receive the support and care they deserve.



With funds from the ARGA Foundation Fund, the Boys and Girls Club Tijuana, A.C. received a donation for the execution of their education, sports, healthy living, art, and human development programs. Overall, we are grateful to the ARGA Foundation Fund for their generosity and support, as these initiatives would not have been possible without their contribution. Together, we strive to create a more inclusive society.

NUMBER OF BENEFICIARIES: 20 seniors, 180 children and teens.



CAUSE-RELATED FUNDS

Thanks to the ARGA Foundation Fund, a donation was made to the "Adopt a Life Hope" Program, aimed at providing oncological treatment to a child with cancer according to their diagnosis and the prescribed medical protocol.

One pediatric patient, 3 years old, diagnosed with Congenital Paravertebral Fibrosarcoma.



With funds from the ARGA Foundation Fund, a donation was made to the Autonomous University of Baja California Foundation through their scholarship programs "ALAS, Opportunities to Fly" and "Enlace UCSD," supporting 67 students from different majors and campuses. For us, student exchange has proven to be a game-changer program that transforms students' lives, strengthening their learning skills both inside and outside the classroom. These life transforming experiences would not be possible without the great response from donors who have accepted to participate in this social project that supports public education through the Autonomous University of Baja California (UABC).

Thanks to the generous fund established by Mrs. Michelle Ivonne Sanchez, known as "Women for Women," a series of impactful fundraising campaigns were launched to provide crucial assistance to women battling cancer. These campaigns focused on facilitating early detection, treatment, and overall well-being for these courageous individuals.

In the year 2022 alone, a remarkable number of 4,350 women were able to receive support through this initiative. This support primarily entailed granting access to vital mammography and ultrasound studies, ensuring that these women could undergo early detection and diagnosis of breast cancer and other related conditions.

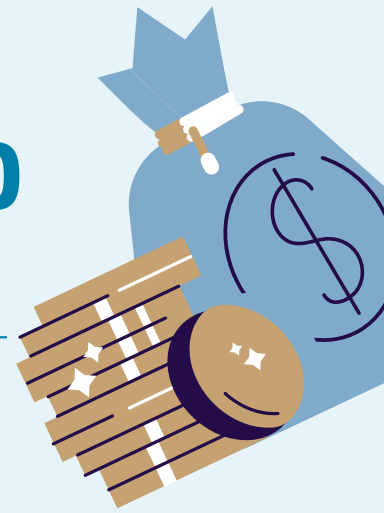

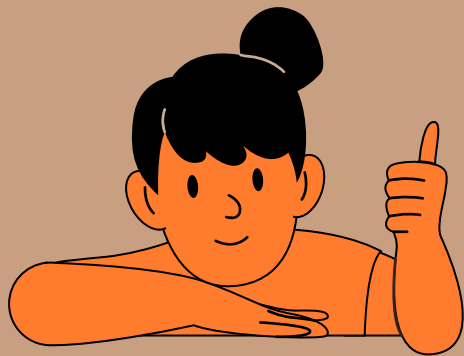
DIAGNOSIS FOR THE SOCIAL INTEGRATION OF MIGRANT CHILDREN IN TIJUANA

We participated in the event "Culture, Identity, and Equity in Our Communities," an initiative by Connecting Communities in the Americas (CCA) held in San Antonio, Texas. During the event, we presented the diagnosis and research report made by the FIC. It is a pleasure to share and work towards #connectingcommunities, promoting the Sustainable Development Goals projected by the United Nations.



MULTIGRADE PROJECT MONARCH CIRCLE

Thanks to the Active New School Learning Circle Program (CAENA), funded by UNICEF and the School New Foundation, in 2022, we provided assistance to 30 children and adolescents. 21 children had their appointments in the United States, and we successfully regularized the status of 9 children and adolescents in mobility contexts, allowing them to enroll in public schools thanks to the Mexican Secretary of Public Education. Now, our program is called Monarch Circle. Building upon what we have achieved and learned in this process, the FIC is pleased to announce the launch of our new project "Metamorphosis from CAENA to Monarch Circle" to support the community and children in mobility contexts in collaboration with the Salesian Project.



LEADERSHIP, SOCIAL SERVICE, AND VOLUNTEERING PROJECTS

In the year 2022, leadership workshops were held for high school students. These workshops aimed to highlight the value of each individual as an important part of a chain of efforts and how teamwork and the combination of talents can enhance results.

The main goal of these workshops was to foster a genuine connection among the young participants, allowing them to recognize themselves as leaders who already possess leadership qualities and will further develop their leadership skills in the coming months and years.

In sum, these workshops were provided to 400 students from CECYTE Villas del Sol, CECYTE Cachanilla, and CECYTE Zona Rio high schools. The workshops prepared them with the necessary tools and knowledge to strengthen their leadership abilities.

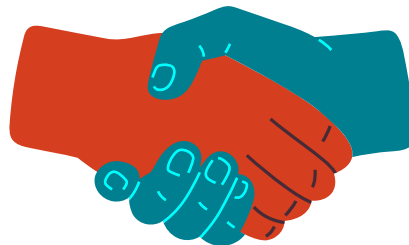
